Twenty-five years ago, a small pilot project for bilingual education began in Basel, Switzerland. With just one class of three students, the foundation for what would become the SIS Swiss International Schools Group was laid. Today, we are proud to see how far we've come. SIS now operates 19 schools across four countries, providing around 5.000 students with a dynamic learning environment and guiding them on their educational journeys.

This year, we are excited to welcome two new schools to the SIS network. The opening of SIS Milano-Basiglio, our first school in Italy, marks a major milestone for the group. Additionally, the launch of SIS Basel-Allschwil, integrated within the Switzerland Innovation Park, offers our students a stimulating setting surrounded by pioneering companies from the life sciences sector.

Following our long-term vision, our newly founded schools will be carefully developed over several years, growing year by year with the educational levels on offer. Previously founded SIS schools are now able to guide students all the way to university entrance qualifications. For instance, our first cohort in Kassel has entered the IB Diploma Programme this school year, while schools in Brasília and Pfäffikon-Schwyz are preparing to offer the IB Diploma Programme from next year onwards. This internationally recognised qualification opens new doors for students, enabling them to pursue higher education both at home and abroad.

As our school group continues to evolve, we are always looking for ways to enrich our students' experiences. We are strengthening our student exchange programme and soon, our secondary school students will have the opportunity to spend time at an SIS school in another country. This unique and exciting programme will allow them to gain invaluable academic and cultural experiences.

Also in this edition, you'll find a fascinating story from the winner of the SIS Best Essay Award 2022 from SIS Friedrichshafen. She shares her unforgettable experience of spending a week with a host family in Rio de Janeiro, immersing herself in the local culture.

Finally, I encourage you to explore the many reports in this magazine, which showcase how our educational philosophy is brought to life across our schools. We are grateful for your trust and continued support. Enjoy reading!

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

English and the national language play equal roles in school communication – in the classroom and in all parts of day-to-day school life. As a result, children learn to express themselves naturally and confidently in both languages.

Independent and Value-Centred Approach

The teaching philosophy at SIS Swiss International School is non-ideological, but founded on clearly defined core values. We strive to embody the values we seek to impart to our students: honesty, appreciation, personal responsibility and commitment.

Day School Community

To meet the needs of modern families and working parents, our day school offers a structured and challenging programme with classroom instruction with fixed hours, lunch, supervised homework hours and additional supervised periods and courses.

Performance through Diversity

The varied, stimulating environment of SIS Swiss International School supports students in achieving excellent academic performance, while allowing them to take enjoyment and pride in what they learn. From kindergarten onwards, students explore the areas of digital technology, programming, media as well as communication and e-safety. In Year 11, we had to write a paper for the German *Abitur*. Later, my class teacher at the time, Ms Grötzinger, informed me that she had submitted my essay for the SIS Best Essay Award (please see the next page for more information). To my surprise, I actually won the prize and was told that I could choose between a voucher with a value of EUR 1.000 or a trip to Rio de Janeiro. As I have always loved travelling and believe that one should use every and any opportunity to learn about the world, it was an easy choice. In hindsight, I could not be happier with my choice, as the memories of the trip will stay with me for life. The trip offered a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to gain insight into a new city, country and culture.

Through my connection to the Brazilian schools, I was always supervised and was taken in and treated like a family member by the best host family I could've asked for. It was a short trip, but thanks to my hosts, I was able to make the absolute most out of it! My feelings at the sight of Christ the Redeemer or Sugarloaf Mountain, and the great beaches, restaurants and bars will stay with me for a lifetime. My hosts showed authentic joy in sharing their pride and love for their city and culture with

me, as well as fulfilling all of my wishes and requests. I was very impressed by how much they love their city; their love and enthusiasm were infectious! For example, I had asked to experience their everyday life and culture as much and as authentically as possible. They happily obliged with this, going out of their way to make it happen. For example, the daughter of my hosts, Clara, let me join one morning that she spent at the beach with her friends. Her parents put a lot of thought into making sure I received local dishes for every meal (e.g. *coração de galinha*; chicken heart), and they were consistently teaching me about our surroundings, telling stories and answering all of my questions. Add to that the amazing weather, the beautiful nature, the never-ending beaches, the incredibly friendly people, the good food, the inspiring cultural heritage sites and the plentiful activities, and it all made for an unforgettable trip.

I think one can tell just how much I enjoyed this trip, and it was definitely not my last time visiting Brazil. That's why I would also like to thank everybody who contributed one more time! And to all students, I can only recommend putting your full effort into your essays, as such a trip is worth it tenfold.



International Activities

SIS Best Essay Award

Annually, the SIS Swiss International Schools Group honours the three best extended essays from graduating students. The written assignments originate in the context of the final examination corresponding to the *Matura*, *Abitur* or International Baccalaureate (IB) exam. The topics of the extended essays vary greatly. However, their common denominator is their presentation of an independent, autonomous piece of reflection and research, captured in a 4.000-word paper.

This year, students in the final year of SIS schools located in Rio de Janeiro, Basel, Zürich, Berlin, Friedrichshafen, Regensburg, Stuttgart-Fellbach and Ingolstadt could take part, but only the best-graded assignment per location was submitted for the SIS Best Essay Award.

All three essays in the ranking display an in-depth study into the respective topic that exceeds expectations. We are proud of the students' commitment and passion that culminated in these excellent papers. We would like to acknowledge the three students as well as their teachers, who supported the students in their extensive research process.

Il bilinguismo è studiare, lavorare, esprimere i propri sentimenti, le proprie competenze e skills, in sostanza “vivere” avendo la possibilità di utilizzare allo stesso modo due linguaggi (nel nostro caso, italiano e inglese), conoscendo di entrambe le lingue le sfumature, i significati più delicati che permettono di interagire nel giusto modo in ogni situazione.

Per fare questo occorre immergersi, fare esperienza, mettersi in gioco durante tutta la giornata, sia durante le lezioni in classe sia nel momento di gioco sia durante il pranzo o l’intervallo.

Il metodo SIS – un pilastro su cui appoggiarsi

Quando ho avuto l’opportunità di conoscere approfonditamente e introdurre nella scuola Primaria che dirigo il Metodo SIS mi sono resa conto del valore pedagogico e culturale che SIS propone ai ragazzi ma anche a noi docenti:

- Un curriculum di 35 ore, di cui 18 in italiano e 17 in inglese.
- Le stesse materie, affrontate sia in italiano sia in inglese.
- In ogni classe una docente di italiano per le unit in italiano e una docente madrelingua inglese per le unit in inglese.

Un metodo che permette ai ragazzi di vivere con normalità la scuola, avendo la possibilità di essere immersi della stessa misura in un ambiente educativo “italiano” e “inglese”.

Il Team di docenti – il vero plus della nostra scuola

Alla Primaria SIS Milano-Basiglio siamo un team di docenti internazionali. Accanto a noi, “maestre italiane”, abbiamo colleghi Britanniche e Statunitensi che oltre a “essere docenti madrelingue” portano un vissuto umano, pedagogico e didattico specifico che permette a noi di arricchire le metodologie di insegnamento e ai ragazzi di aprirsi alla dimensione internazionale.

Quale livello linguistico si acquisisce al termine della Scuola Primaria?

Il nostro obiettivo è quello che tutti i risultati didattici e formativi previsti dal quadro normativo italiano e dal curriculum internazionale siano raggiunti dai nostri studenti, sia in italiano sia in inglese.

Saper argomentare e riferire di argomenti diverse aree del sapere con la stessa padronanza in entrambe le lingue è il nostro obiettivo.

Ogni bambino è unico e irripetibile e così i suoi tempi dell’apprendimento: per questo dobbiamo avere l’attenzione a che ciascuno raggiunga con gradualità i propri traguardi didattici e formativi e accompagnarli in maniera personale: è questa la bellezza del nostro lavoro! Far fiorire ogni ragazzo nel miglior modo possibile!

SUMMARY

Bilingualism is the ability to study, work, and express one’s feelings, skills and abilities in two languages (in our case Italian and English) in the same way – essentially, to “live” in both languages. It’s the unique capacity to communicate in each while understanding the nuances, the most delicate meanings of both languages that allow one to interact in the right way in every situation. At SIS, we use the immersion method of language learning, which invites children to dive headfirst into the foreign language. Students use the second language to engage with the world in a playful and completely natural way.

Lernen, Entfalten und Wachsen – das Ganztagsangebot der SIS Basel-Allschwil

Zu den acht Grundpfeilern des SIS Bildungskonzepts gehört auch die ganztägige Schulgemeinschaft. Sie bildet das Schulfundament und schafft ein Umfeld, in dem Schülerinnen und Schüler lernen und sich in ihrer Persönlichkeit entfalten können. Unser strukturiertes Ganztagsangebot bietet durchgängigen zweisprachigen Unterricht in Blockzeiten. Dazu kommen ein gemeinsamer Mittagstisch, Mittwochsclub, betreute Hausaufgabenstunden sowie zusätzliche, individuell buchbare Betreuungszeiten und vielseitige Kurse am Nachmittag sowie in den Schulferien. Ein klarer Tagesablauf unterstützt die Zeit-einteilung, Organisation und Eigenverantwortung zu erlernen, während regelmässige Pausen ein ausgewogenes Verhältnis zwischen Lernen und Freizeit sicherstellen.

Seit dem Schulstart im August 2024 besteht auch hier an der SIS Basel-Allschwil bereits das Angebot der Hausaufgabenstunden, des Mittwochsclubs und der Betreuung vor und nach dem Unterricht sowie des Mittagstisches, welches laufend mit dem Wachstum der Schule ausgebaut wird. Die Musikschule ist genauso Teil unseres Tagesschulangebots und nimmt laufend neue Schülerinnen und Schüler auf, die die individuell buchbaren Musiklektionen hier in unseren Räumlichkeiten wahrnehmen.

Das breitgefächerte Angebot an Aktivitäten, von Sport über Kunst bis hin zu Musik und Sprachen, ermöglicht es den Schülerinnen und Schülern ihre Interessen zu entdecken und vielseitige Fähigkeiten zu entwickeln. So werden im Mittwochsclub gerne Perlenketten hergestellt und Stofftaschen bedruckt. In der Betreuung nach 16 Uhr stärken wir das Zusammensein mit kleinen kreativen Projekten, vielen spielerischen Aktivitäten und einer gemeinsamen Zwischenmahlzeit, dem sogenannten «Z'Vieri», wie man hier auf Schweizerdeutsch sagt.

Durch gemeinsames Lernen, Essen, Spielen und ausserschulischen Aktivitäten entwickeln die Schülerinnen und Schüler nicht nur akademische, sondern auch soziale, emotionale und

kulturelle Kompetenzen. Sie fördern Empathie und kritisches Denken, was ihnen hilft, komplexe Probleme zu lösen und sich in einer globalisierten Welt sicher zu bewegen. Die Ganztagschule schafft ein förderndes Umfeld, das jedes Kind individuell unterstützt und es auf dem Weg zu selbstbewussten, verantwortungsvollen Mitgliedern der Gesellschaft begleitet.

SUMMARY


The SIS educational concept is based on eight key aspects, including a day school community that fosters learning and personal growth. From Roots in Primary to Fruit in Secondary: Bilingual Education in Secondary School and Beyond

This past June, I had the opportunity to sit in on the oral Matura exams at SIS Basel. There, students discussed German literature in depth, ranging from classical authors such as Gotthold Lessing to contemporary writers like Juli Zeh. Students needed to identify the source of a literary excerpt and discuss the author, the work, and the time period in which it was composed. They then answered a series of questions that demanded an even higher level of thinking. The same exam was administered a week later for English literature.

Looking at the impressive work of our students in their oral exams – being able to analyse Kästner and Shakespeare in their original languages – I can't help but reflect on the roots of these skills: SIS primary.

It is one thing to become bilingual, speaking two (or even more) languages fluently. However, it is a greater achievement to become biliterate: being able to read and write in that second language with the same proficiency and ease. Of the 31 students who graduated this past year, more than half had been at our school since the primary years. There, it was standard practice to switch languages daily: Monday's maths exercises were completed in German, Tuesday's successive exercises were completed in English. This established the bilingual foundation that led to their success in the exams.

Nurturing Biliteracy

When I respond to the question, "Why SIS?", my answer is this: our students have the tools for success at the university level and beyond. By nurturing biliteracy alongside academic rigour, we ensure that our students not only excel in their studies but also thrive in an increasingly globalised world where communication and cultural understanding are paramount. Looking ahead, the fruits of bilingual education will continue to enrich the lives of our graduates, shaping them into versatile and culturally adept individuals.


My Journey at SIS: From Childhood to University

One of my earliest memories is when my parents dropped me off at SIS Männedorf-Zürich for my first day of kindergarten, where I started my SIS journey of seven years. My time at SIS Männedorf-Zürich is marked by fond memories: of first crushes, exams, the annual summer festival and much more. I especially valued the smaller classes, allowing for a close, tight-knit circle of friends, and the exceptional help I received from my teachers in all subjects and matters. Due to the wide respect, kindness and solidarity that existed amongst the students, I often played with the older kids as well, learning a lot from them. Additionally, the implementation of SIS values from students would be rewarded through the granting of “shining stars”, a practice that motivated the students to really reflect upon those values. As an SIS child, I can safely say that the values I learned in primary stuck with me through the rest of my school years and now follow me into my future.

Multicultural Friendships and Personal Growth

For the second half of my school life, I attended SIS Zürich in Wallisellen, where I met my best friend and grew from a child to a half-fledged adult with an IB Diploma. The bilingual system has granted me a great advantage in my studies and future career and has allowed me to make friends from different cultures since kindergarten, a privilege I hold dear to my heart, granting me an openness and tolerance I value greatly. In college, even when I struggled for a while to decide between the IB and *Matura*, the unwavering support from my teachers and peers helped me find my own path. In the end, I suppose SIS will always remain my second home where I spent more than half of my life and made more than half of my memories. Thanks to my long journey at SIS, I am now fully prepared to embark on a new adventure at the University of St. Gallen and carry all that I have learned from my time at SIS with me into the future.

Neues zweisprachiges Gymnasium an der SIS Pfäffikon-Schwyz

Seit August 2023 gibt es die Möglichkeit an der SIS Pfäffikon-Schwyz nach der 2. oder 3. Sekundarschule eine Ausbildung zur Erlangung der zweisprachigen eidgenössischen Matura zu absolvieren. Der Lehrgang bereitet auf die eidgenössischen Maturaprüfungen vor. Bedingung für den Eintritt ins Gymnasium an der SIS Pfäffikon-Schwyz ist ein Durchschnitt von mindestens 4.75 am Ende der Sekundarschule.

Wenn der Durchschnitt tiefer ist, aber mindestens 4.5 beträgt, oder wenn eine Schülerin oder ein Schüler vom Ausland in die Schweiz zieht und die deutsche Sprache noch nicht sehr gut beherrscht, kann nach der Absolvierung der 3. Sekundarschule ein Eintritt in das «International Baccalaureate-Vorbereitungsjahr» (10. Schuljahr) in Erwägung gezogen werden. Im 11. und im 12. Schuljahr werden wir neu ab Schuljahr 2025/2026 das IB-Diplomprogramm anbieten.

Unterschiedliche Anforderungen der Programme

Der Unterschied zwischen den zwei angebotenen Programmen ist, dass die bestandene Schweizer Matura den prüfungsfreien Eintritt an alle Schweizer Hochschulen und die meisten internationalen Universitäten erlaubt. Je nach Universität muss im IB-Diplom eine bestimmte Punktzahl erreicht sein, um direkt mit dem Studium zu beginnen. Außerdem erfordert das IB-Programm eine grosse Selbständigkeit von Seiten der Studierenden.



SUMMARY

Since August 2023, it has been possible to enrol at our newly launched College to obtain the bilingual Swiss Federal Matura after Year 8 or Year 9 at secondary school. From the academic year 2025/2026, we will be offering the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme in Years 11 and 12, which leads to the IB Diploma. It is important for both courses that students have a good command of both English and German. However, the language focus in each course is different: in the Matura course, 5 out of 13 subjects are taught in English. In the IB course, 6 out of 9 subjects are taught in English.

Wichtig ist für beide Lehrgänge, sowohl Englisch als auch Deutsch gut bis sehr gut zu beherrschen. Der Schwerpunkt ist jedoch unterschiedlich: Im Maturalehrgang werden 5 von 13 Fächern und im IB-Lehrgang 6 von 9 Fächern auf Englisch unterrichtet. Die Schülerinnen und Schüler an der SIS Pfäffikon-Schwyz sind es sich allerdings seit dem Kindergarten gewohnt, in zwei Sprachen zu denken und zu sprechen.

Das Unterrichten in den Schuljahren 11 und 12 erfordert von den Lehrpersonen grosse Flexibilität und viel Differenzierung im Unterricht, da sich die Bedürfnisse der Studierenden im Hinblick auf ihre Abschlüsse teils unterscheiden. Der tägliche Austausch zwischen den beiden Schultypen auf der Gymnasium-Stufe führt für die Studierenden zu einer offeneren Sicht im Hinblick auf ein späteres Studium oder den Eintritt in die Arbeitswelt.

Making Maths Matter: Bridging the Gap Between Mathematics and Everyday Life

Mathematics often gets a bad reputation, with students questioning its relevance to daily life. To address this, educators must demonstrate how maths applies beyond the classroom by incorporating real-life applications into lessons. At SIS Rotkreuz-Zug, we tackle this by using scenarios students can relate to, like designing a smoothie for a fictitious company to teach fractions and proportions.

Math Made Fun and Practical

Financial literacy, a vital life skill, is also integrated into the curriculum. Through lessons on budgeting, saving, and investing, students learn how to calculate interest and make informed financial decisions. In the “Game of Life” simulation, they must manage a savings account, income, and expenses, learning how to apply maths to personal finance.

Geometry, often perceived as abstract, becomes tangible when applied to design and architecture. Students explore concepts like area, perimeter, and volume by designing floor plans and analysing blueprints, making geometric principles more relatable and practical.

Aber was genau machen wir eigentlich?



The Power of Experience: Why BOGY Work Placements and Social Placements in Baden-Württemberg Are a Game-Changer for SIS Students

In Baden-Württemberg, a week of work experience for Year 10 students or a social placement for Year 9 students is more than just a traditional rite of passage; each provides a powerful experience that shapes young minds and bridges the gap between education and the world of work. These two types of internships that take place every year at SIS Friedrichshafen both aim to foster social competence and increase confidence and self-esteem, enabling first-hand insight into a wide range of professions and helping to demystify the world of work. The feedback from the students and the organisations in which they were placed was particularly positive this year, with one student offered a trainee position in a retirement home and others given the opportunity to return both before and after graduation. Some are even thinking of social volunteering on a regular basis, with two offered a position when they finish their education!

Preparing for Real-World Opportunities

A social placement or BOGY (*Berufsorientierung an Gymnasien*; vocational orientation at college level) week is the culmination of a lot of hard work for the students, who need to be prepped early in the academic year in order to secure high quality placements with good organisations to give them a worthwhile experience. For many Year 10 students, the transition from

school to work can seem daunting, but this early exposure allows students to explore different career paths and industries, providing valuable insights to guide their future educational and career choices. Last year, at SIS Friedrichshafen, our 18 social placement students secured diverse placements in kindergartens, retirement homes, and an animal shelter, whilst our 27 BOGY students secured some sought-after work placements across the legal and medical sectors, in addition to others with prestigious organisations such as Rolls-Royce/MTU, ZF Friedrichshafen AG, the Messe and the *Institut für Seenforschung* (institute of lake research). It can be the catalyst for change some students need in order to take full advantage of the opportunities available to them at SIS in Years 11 and 12.

Sustainability in Action: How SIS Ingolstadt Kindergarten Leads by Example

One and a half years ago, the kindergarten at SIS Ingolstadt began its journey towards sustainability. Introducing the idea of sustainability at an early age seems the right thing to do, as particularly the younger generation will face significant global challenges due to climate change, the loss of biodiversity, and increasingly scarce resources. This requires us to rethink our lifestyles. The SIS community, as well as everyone else, is called upon to preserve a world worth living in. To be able to offer the children a good introduction to the topic of sustainability, the kindergarten team attended training events over the past year and a half.

Engaging the Community

The team, the children, and the parents worked closely together and, through various projects, the kindergarten has taken the first steps towards becoming more sustainable. The children separate their rubbish into plastic, paper, and general waste. We have saved on purchasing new materials by using resources that were already available and cut down on paper and packaging. For example, each group has a wooden birthday treasure box from which the child can choose items, instead of individually wrapped presents. During Advent, we replaced packaged presents with four parent-led activities, such as reading books, baking, or crafting with materials on-site. We have planted fruits and vegetables and are in the process of replacing plastic toys with sustainable toys made from natural materials.

Awarded as a Sustainable Kindergarten

After one and a half years of projects, sustainability training, and identifying suitable topics and solutions, the kindergarten received the award "Kita im Aufbruch" for being a sustainable day care centre from the State Association for Bird and Nature Conservation in Bavaria (LBV – Landesbund für Vogel- und Naturschutz in Bayern e.V.) and the Bavarian State Ministry for the Environment and Consumer Protection (Bayerisches Staatsministerium für Umwelt und Verbraucherschutz) on 24 April 2024.

I B-elieve in the Diploma Programme

Our journey towards becoming an IB World School began in spring 2023 when we conducted a feasibility study within our school community to consult with students and parents about our intention to offer the IB Diploma Programme. We aimed for first teaching in 2024, aligning with the entry of our oldest year group into Year 12.

We applied for candidate school status in May 2023, and it quickly became clear how much work lay ahead. The IB provided us with a consultant to guide us through the rigorous authorisation process. With their support, along with contributions from teachers across the SIS network, we made swift progress from candidate to authorised status.

The IB sets high standards for becoming an IB World School, and we were well-positioned to meet many of these requirements, thanks to our school's already high expectations and strong internal policies. However, some challenges emerged, such as the need to build a secure storage room for exam papers to meet IB security standards and to provide emergency showers in the science laboratory for chemistry safety protocols.



Growing Together

Throughout the year, our teaching staff engaged in numerous collaborative meetings to discuss how the IB philosophy aligns with and can be further integrated into the SIS ethos. These discussions enabled cross-departmental collaboration and the sharing of best practices among teachers.

In June 2024, we achieved IB World School status and began teaching in August, with our first exams scheduled for 2026. The most significant outcome of this process has been the strengthening of our internal bonds and the creation of new connections within the SIS network. One of our core values is maintaining a "Strong Network", and the IB authorisation process has highlighted how effectively we can support one another in the future.

Internationaler Tag der Muttersprache

Das vielfältige Angebot unserer Welt in allen Bereichen kann uns bisweilen überfordern. Zu viele Angebote, zu viele Unterschiede. Das ist anstrengend. Unser Gehirn hätte es gerne einfacher. Dabei erfolgt Lernen vor allem durch die Konfrontation mit der Unterschiedlichkeit und Vielfalt.

Eine internationale Schulgemeinschaft bietet durch die zahlreichen Alters-, Geschlechts- oder Kulturunterschiede vielfache Ansätze zu vielseitigem Lernen. Vielfalt in Sprech-, Schul- und Sprachgemeinschaft

Der Internationale Tag der Muttersprache wird an der SIS Regensburg seit Langem als Projekttag gestaltet, an dem sich die Schülerinnen und Schüler mit der sprachlichen Vielfalt ihrer Schul- und Sprachgemeinschaft auseinandersetzen.

Besonders beliebt ist die Erarbeitung von Videos, die sich mit dem Thema Sprachen befassen. Zum einen werden dramaturgische Planung und Medienkompetenzen geschult, zum anderen können die Ergebnisse durch das Filmformat in besonders unterhaltsamer Weise mit der Schulgemeinschaft geteilt werden; eine für alle sehr lebendige Auseinandersetzung mit unterschiedlichen Aspekten der Sprachen.



Bildung in der Schriftlichkeit erfahren Schülerinnen und Schüler über Briefe und Postkarten, vor allem, wenn diese von Erstsprachlern vorgelesen werden. Die vielfältigen Schriften und Schriftbilder, sowie Klangbilder lassen die sonst doch sehr abstrakten, fernen und fremden Sprachen näher rücken und lebendig werden.

Sicht- und erfahrbar wird die sprachliche und kulturelle Vielfalt aber auch durch ein internationales Buffet. In fremde Sprachen und Kulturen hinein zu schmecken ist vielleicht das wertvollste und nachhaltigste Lernerlebnis in einer großen Sprech-, Schul- und Sprachgemeinschaft.

Nicht zuletzt ist der Tag der Muttersprache eine Gelegenheit, uns gegenseitig in unserer Vielfalt wahrzunehmen und wertzuschätzen.



Seit 2008 bietet die SIS Stuttgart-Fellbach durchgängige Bildung von Kindergarten bis Abitur und ermöglicht reibungslose Übergänge zwischen den Schulstufen. Wie erleben die Schüler diesen Weg? Wir haben Clemens und Ben, zwei Abiturienten der ersten Generationen, die die SIS von der 1. Klasse bis zum Abschluss besucht haben, dazu befragt.

Was sind für euch die wichtigsten Besonderheiten, seit der 1. Klasse an dieser Schule zu sein?

Clemens: Für mich ist besonders, dass uns einige Lehrkräfte durch unser ganzes Schulleben oder zumindest viele Jahre, begleitet haben, das gibt es selten. Viele Lehrkräfte, z.B. aus der Grundschule, hat man vielleicht nicht mehr im Unterricht, aber man kennt und sieht sich noch.

Ben: Dadurch, dass man viele Lehrkräfte so lange kennt, hat man einen ganz anderen Bezug zu ihnen. Man ist selbst als Schüler dadurch offener den Lehrerinnen und Lehrern gegenüber und hat mehr Vertrauen, Fragen zu stellen oder um Hilfe zu bitten.

Inwiefern hat euch das in eurer persönlichen Entwicklung geholfen?

Clemens: Der bilinguale Unterricht hat dazu geführt, dass Englisch meine zweite Muttersprache geworden ist. Ich fand auch die kleinen Klassen sehr gut, so konnten die Lehrer viel mehr auf die einzelnen Schüler eingehen.

Ben: Für mich hat sich über die vielen Jahre eine sehr starke emotionale Bindung an unsere Schule entwickelt. Es fühlt sich ein bisschen an wie ein zweites zu Hause. Ich kann mir noch gar nicht vorstellen, wie es sein wird nach den Ferien nicht mehr jeden Tag hierher zu kommen.

Wie hat euch die Schule auf eure Zukunft vorbereitet?

Clemens: Vor allem durch die Zweisprachigkeit, und die Möglichkeit, ein Abitur und sogar das IB Diplom zu machen. Dadurch stehen uns sehr viele Optionen offen. Wir können ohne große Probleme in vielen anderen Ländern studieren, das finde ich toll.

Ben: Ein Studium im Ausland wird für uns eine Option, die man ganz natürlich mit in Betracht zieht. Das Umfeld und die Schule fördern, dass man offener für Ideen ist.




SUMMARY

Inovação e Tecnologia na Educação: A Implementação do Currículo de TI

Nesse ano, iniciamos a implementação do currículo de TI da SIS na Escola Nova by SIS. O currículo foi estrategicamente estruturado para oferecer suporte à equipe pedagógica, desde a Educação Infantil até os anos finais do Ensino Fundamental I. O objetivo é desenvolver habilidades progressivas, permitindo que os alunos avancem à medida que consolidam competências em quatro áreas essenciais: programação, tecnologia digital, mídia, comunicação e segurança.

A equipe tem demonstrado grande dedicação e comprometimento, aplicando os conhecimentos adquiridos nas sessões de treinamento e envolvendo os alunos de forma ativa no processo de ensino-aprendizagem. Um exemplo disso é uma aula sobre a observação e classificação de animais, que se torna muito mais interessante com o uso dos Beebots e um tapete ilustrado com dicas e desafios para novas descobertas. Outros gadgets também enriquecem o aprendizado transversal dos estudantes, como em uma atividade de língua portuguesa aliada à codificação em linha.

O entusiasmo crescente dos alunos pelo aprendizado:

Com novas abordagens e inovações integradas às aulas de TI, os professores estão criando um ambiente cada vez mais dinâmico. O reflexo disso pode ser visto no entusiasmo dos alunos, que estão se tornando participantes mais ativos na construção do conhecimento e cada vez mais motivados a explorar as novas tecnologias apresentadas.



SUMMARY

This year, Escola Nova by SIS introduced the SIS IT curriculum. The curriculum aims to progressively build students' skills in key areas: programming, digital technology, media, communication, and safety. Teachers have actively applied their training, engaging students with innovative tools like Beebots and other gadgets. Additionally, the school participated in the Hacktudo event offering programming workshops for children. The successful implementation of the IT curriculum is fostering a dynamic learning environment, with students showing increased enthusiasm for exploring new technologies.

Economy Week at ESB Rio de Janeiro: A Unique Learning Experience






An Unforgettable Experience for All

Teaching German as the First Foreign Language in a Brazilian School

It's interesting to notice some peculiarities and particularities in foreign language teaching in Brazil. One of the things we notice is that Brazil is the only country in Latin America whose first language is Portuguese. Another point to consider is the fact that Brazil is surrounded by Spanish-speaking countries, which makes it the usual language of choice when it comes to foreign languages in Brazilian schools. At SIS Brasília, however, our choice is different from the usual and that has a big influence on our students.

By teaching German as a foreign language, we ensure that our students have the opportunity to learn a language they would hardly be able to learn elsewhere in Brazil. The importance of German is also easy to highlight to our school families, as German is the second most widely spoken first language in Europe. It is also a language that opens new doors to students regarding their higher education options; learning German opens up the possibility for our students to study in Germany, Switzerland or Austria, countries well known for their quality of education.

A Window to New Perspectives

Learning a new language is like opening a window to a new future, seeing and understanding things differently. Sometimes, the choice of which language to learn is limited by where you are, or even by what seems to be the obvious choice. By offering German, SIS Brasília seeks to broaden our students' horizons, going beyond what they usually see. It's a chance to reflect on their own culture and what the norm is while enriching their repertoire to face a globalised world. There are very few schools in the region that allow students to learn German, and we're happy with the prospects that this possibility offers our learners at SIS Brasília.
